Adult Basketry

January 14

Come learn how to weave a traditional 10 inch ribbed egg basket. This basket is made using two oak hoops joined with a "God's Eye" technique and the sides are woven using rattan reed. This is sure to be a useful basket, even if you don't use it to carry eggs. Although loaner tools will be available, bring an awl for adjusting reeds, knife to sharpen the ribs and diagonal wire cutters to cut the reed of you have them.
